10th October 2019

This week we have been talking about teamwork and the importance of helping our friends. We saw the importance of this when we went to the park with the Wise Owls on Wednesday. The children were helping each other to use the equipment as well as working together to negotiate space to make sure everyone had a safe and fun time.

In the room the children have been enjoying working with different mark making materials to create individual pictures as well as a large scale drawing. The large scale drawing helps to

encourage gross motor skills which will later be refined into their find motor skills for writing.





Following the Children's Interests

At Preschool we do not focus or plan for topic work instead choosing to follow the children's interests and daily leads. We find that this way of working encourages deeper understanding and greater interactions from the children as they are directly interested in what we are learning about. This is a recognised and preferred method of learning by Ofsted.

Staff regularly observe, assess and record the children's development on Tapestry and plan for their focused next steps accordingly. If you have any questions regarding this please speak to your Key Worker.

What do you see here?



If you see a big mess, look again! We see the aftermath of the children re-enacting their train journey to Rugby (which was over two weeks ago). What started off as a simple train track developed into needing farm animals and hedgerows; diggers and cars; houses and tunnels and a camel because apparently we saw one of those on the train too!

Was it a mission to tidy away?

Not at all, all of the children worked together to collect the trains into one box, then the tracks, the wooden blocks and the farm animals. All tidy within 5 minutes.

What did they learn?

Critical thinking, working together, listening to others, recalling and talking of events that are important to them, selecting resources for play and we had LOTS OF FUN!

Marking the Seasons



On Wednesday we spoke to the children about the changing seasons. Linda had collected some leaves on her way to Preschool for us to look at. The leaves were different colours but the same shape so we think they came off the same tree. Harlow told us that the leaves are falling off the trees because it is Autumn time. In the afternoon we decided to go for a walk to see if we could find some more leaves to add to our display. We also learnt a new word, Hibernation! Which is when the

hedgehogs go to sleep for a long time, "it's more than 40 minutes but not a year". Linda told us that the hedgehogs would be going to sleep until Spring time. This has left us with many questions which we hope to answer in the coming days.... Where do the hedgehogs sleep?

Do they get hungry? What other animals hibernate? And most importantly, if the hedgehogs are asleep at Christmas, does Santa still deliver their presents?

The children have been asked to have a think about what they would want in their room if they were hibernating for Winter. We look forward to hearing their ideas in the coming few days.

We have been fortunate in the past to purchase other equipment using such schemes. Such as the outdoor equipment with money from the Nationwide scheme. If you are a parent who works for a company with a similar scheme please let us know. We are able to help complete the paperwork.
